~ A Message from the Diocesan Spiritual Advisor ~

I stopped the traffic this week!

I was out walking early in the morning, and I was being quietly amused by a truck turning off the main road, travelling so far along the side road before the driver realised his truck was too high for the rail bridge ahead. I watched him stop, consider his options, then start backing up. I paced him along the way. We got to the main road – a busy arterial road. He leant over in the cab, opened the passenger door and called down – *Can you help?*
Sure, I said. I'll stop the traffic for you.

So, during an appropriate gap in the stream of cars and buses, I strode out to the middle and raised both my hands, STOP – *this had better work God, I prayed.*

Reflecting on the moment as I walked on home, I realised that what I had done was what we're called to do as Christians and as Cursillistas. (Apart from the bit about quiet amusement of course – that's just to let you know that I can be 'not nice.')

We're called to travel in company with our family, our friends, our neighbours near and far; keeping an eye on them; to be present with them through the challenges of life; to serve and resource them as we are able and when the time comes to part, to see them on their way to live their own lives.

I'm remembering the story of Jesus and the Widow of Nain (Luke 7:11-17). Remember how as he approached the gates to the town he noticed a funeral procession – a woman's only son was being taken for burial. He had great compassion for the widow's situation – and a great miracle followed. Jesus indeed was seen to be *God with us.*

How and where does Cursillo encourage us to be, to live and to act as *God with Us*? I know you already know the answer but humour me. Of course, it's through our 4th Day Groups which function as our support and accountability communities. As a small group of friends, we meet regularly to nurture our commitment to God – to share the way our faith, our commitment to transform our environments for Christ are being lived out in our daily lives.

Now maybe you'll never be called to stop the traffic – but maybe you'll be picking up someone to take them to Church, or maybe inviting someone over for a cuppa, or reading your children/grandchildren stories from the Bible; simple everyday things illustrating you're sharing God's Good News in word or deed.

Don't let fear or doubt or habit stop you from taking your part in allowing the miracle of *God With Us* to be let loose in our world.

OUR FOURTH DAY; A CONTINUING PILGRIMAGE of OUR SPIRITUAL LIVES



Over breakfast on the last day of the pilgrimage, at Maryborough, I shared these thoughts about how **our Cursillo fourth day is a continuing pilgrimage of our spiritual lives.**

For over one thousand years, The Camino has been a pilgrim trail across northern Spain which leads to the tomb of Saint James the Apostle in the city of Santiago de Compostela.

PREPARATION

Undertaking any pilgrimage requires intentional preparation and training. Rod and I spent 12 months, walking many trails, building up our stamina and muscles for the task of travelling the Camino.

Each cursillo weekend, the dedicated teams prayerfully and diligently prepare for the programme. The sponsors encourage and support their candidate to understand the commitment required to undertake the 3-day cursillo experience. Prayerful preparation builds resilience and fortitude.

GROUP REUNION



Each pilgrim must make their own unique journey, setting out in faith and trusting that God is calling them onwards. Each day we set out to walk the way, seeking to follow the signs and markers along the road or on the buildings. We were always encouraged by the company of other pilgrims, both ahead and behind.

At the beginning of each day, we set out not knowing where we would lay our heads that night but gratefully trusting that God would provide a resting place. We were welcomed into many wonderful refuges and communities who provided hospitality to travellers on the road. The delight in sharing with others the joy of each day over simple meals and listening to each pilgrims' stories of miracle encounters and provision. The blessing of the ministry of foot washing for tired and sore feet was indescribable. The faith communities blessing of the pilgrims' services ministered to our souls.

As we journey on into the fourth day, we need to remember to take the opportunity to travel with others, in group reunion. Whether it is with a large establish group in the parish, or with a friend, or even on zoom, it means continuing to walk each day with purpose and in prayer trusting God to direct and guide our path.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTON

The greatest encouragement we discovered was to seek the company of those who had done the journey before us. This was invaluable advice as well as challenging us to be well prepared for what lay ahead.

With our spiritual pilgrimage it is vital to search and pray for someone whose wisdom and knowledge we can rely upon into the future.

The person may be a trusted clergy, or soul friend or a person trained in Spiritual direction. The important message is not to travel alone but seek God's direction through the times you may not clearly see or know the way ahead.

As we walked the paths each day, many of the people in the countryside, would call to us, "BON CAMINO!", (good journey), this was such a huge encouragement and would lift the spirit. Everyone needs a strong coach on the sideline to cheer us onwards or pick us up when we stumble.

ULTREYA.....ONWARD AND UPWARD

Many times we encountered the word Ultreya written on the road or on signs on the pathways. One I remember said 57km to go, which meant 200km were behind us, and was such an encouragement!

Ultreya gatherings are varied and widely available in our Diocese and such a wonderful opportunity to come, to celebrate, share, witness, sing, worship, and pray together. Each gives us the opportunity to meet with dear treasured friends, plus welcome and make new friends.

We hope to meet you along the journey.

In Maryborough when Sandra produced her folders of On Wings Like Eagles, 3 day group photos and documents from the beginning of the Cursillo movement in this diocese everyone gathered around to reminisce.



The following has been taken from the first Brisbane Diocesan Cursillo Newsletter before this publication became known as On Wings Like Eagles - OWLE. "Those who trust in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar like eagles." Isaiah 40:31.

The First Spiritual Director for Cursillo in Brisbane was Rev. Bruce Worthington who was then Rector of St Mark's, The Gap Parish. He wrote the following for the first newsletter:-

FROM THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR.

ULTREYA - ONWARDS AND UPWARDS - PERSERVERANCE. 1985 OPENED TO US A NEW CHALLENGE IN OUR CHRISTIAN JOURNEY, A FRESH EXPERIENCE OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST, OF BEING MEMBERS OF HIS BODY, AND OF SHARING AND GROWING TOGETHER IN FAITH AND ACTION. 1986 OPENS THE DOOR TO THE CHALLENGE OF REACHING OUT IN LOVE AND MINISTRY TO OTHERS THROUGH CURSILLO AND THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ENCOURAGING AND SUPPORTING ONE ANOTHER. THIS IS ESPECIALLY SO FOR THOSE WHO WILL BE ON TEAMS THIS YEAR. THEY WILL NEED ALL OF THE PRAYER SUPPORT AND ENCOURAGEMENT THAT CURSILLISTAS CAN GIVE.

GOD HAS CALLED US AND WE MUST RESPOND TO THAT CALL WITH A POSITIVE AND AFFIRMATIVE ATTITUDE KNOWING THAT IN CHRIST WE CAN DO ALL THAT GOD ASKS US TO DO. WHAT HE ASKS OF US IS OUR WHOLEHEARTED COMMITMENT AND A POSITIVE ATTITUDE THAT WE SHALL ACCOMPLISH IN THE YEAR AHEAD WHATEVER IT IS HE HAS FOR US TO DO AND WITH IT A WILLINGNESS TO MEET THE COST AND TO ENCOURAGE ONE ANOTHER IN LOVE AND ACTION.
