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~ A Message from the Diocesan Spiritual Advisor ~

There's an odd word in the Hobbit dialect - mathom. Do you know it?

The great English writer J. R. R. Tolkien the author of the fantasy novels, "*The Hobbit*" and "*The Lord of the Rings*" tweaked an Old English word *máðm* meaning a treasure, a valuable or precious thing so that in "Hobbit Land" (The Shire) it was the generic term for all those special things Hobbits had no immediate use for but were unwilling to throw away. What saved their dwellings from being overcrowded with *mathoms* was their practice of passing them on from hand to hand - re-gifting them at birthdays or when friends came visiting.

It was not unusual for precious things to pass through many hands and end up being received again with delight by the original giver.

Re-gifting (especially re-gifting of our precious treasure) is a great concept.

It's what Christmas is all about.

Before you rise up in your seats in outrage, let me assure you that I'm not talking about scarves, or socks or soap.

I'm talking about how each year we're given the most marvelous gift - the story of Mary and Joseph; of angels and shepherds; of magi and a star; of God choosing to be among us, inviting us into the ongoing creation of a world aflame with God's glory and love and shalom for all.

Each year we come to celebrate the story - maybe in awe and wonder, maybe from family habit, maybe to please another – and possibly, because once again this year all the normal certainties have been stood on their heads as Covid has thrown us another curve ball, just as we thought we were on the way to freedom.

There's a hard knot of uncertainty and fear around what the future holds in store, and it calls me, and possibly you as well, to question my values, my meaning and purpose - the very way I live.

Maybe we come to Christmas hoping, wondering even, if it could indeed be possible that we can trust that God is with us; that God is our salvation. Maybe God's unveiling at the Christmass, God's way of nonviolent love, living in vulnerability with integrity and truth, is the counterpoint we, and our world, needs against the dehumanising rules, regulations and expectations that govern our lives and fill our media.

This year, reach out your hands, receive the gift, don't just put it to one side as a purposeless treasure.

Instead, unwrap it, hold it up to the light, explore its depth, question its meaning, follow your heart to the source of joy - then (and here's the delicious irony) join the great circle of faith re-gifters.

I wish you God's blessing as you spread the love as you pass on the greatest story ever told to those around you. As St Francis is reputed to have said – If necessary, you can even use words.

Group Reunions

Part of the Fourth Day, Group Reunions are an integral part of the glue that keeps your Weekend memories alive. It was heartening to hear so many "Groupings" being held on a weekly, fortnightly, and monthly basis. Some have been happening for over 20 years. If you are not in a Group at the moment, please consider starting or joining one. We have so many opportunities now if we can't meet face to face, we can do so using Skype, Facebook Live, Zoom, Face Time, etc.

Ultreyas

As another Fourth Day tool, we are so pleased with the increase in attendees at Ultreyas. To see friendships made and existing ones developed further at these events, warms everyone's heart. Just a quick shout out to everyone who has had a part in each of the Ultreyas this year, "Thank You".

Candidates for Next Year

M81 & W81 times have been set in place for next year. We have 132 parishes in our diocese. We have set a cost for sending a Candidate to under \$300. When \$300 is divided by 52 weeks it is less than \$5.90 weekly. It would be great if we could strive to send at least one Candidate from each parish every year. This would be 132 Candidates, for the year. Back to 1985 numbers when Cursillo was new to the diocese.

Secretariat (and how to be selected)

Many Cursillistas are unaware of what Secretariat actually is. It is just a fancy name for a voluntary committee. Secretariat meets every 6 weeks to discuss Cursillo, past, present and future. Secretariat is made up of Cursillistas from within our diocese. Selection is based on experience of the Cursillo process. For example: Weekend Team involvement, work skills (such as accountancy for the Treasurer's position), being Parish Contact, or involvement with organising an Ultreya, etc.

If you have skills to offer Cursillo, please make it known to your Parish Contact or any member of Secretariat.

Finally, we have a great program for you in 2022 with Ultreyas, a Pilgrimage and of course M81 & W81 in August-September.

May you have a Happy and Blessed Christmas with your family and friends.

WHAT DO CANDIDATES NEED TO KNOW?

We have recently been members of the M80 and W80 Cursillo team. On the Sunday evenings, we heard a number of the candidates say that they had no idea what the Cursillo weekend was about. They had just trusted their sponsors. This is great but to help their uncertainty about attending a weekend, sponsors might like to consider giving potential candidates more information about the weekend. Here is a suggestion.

The Cursillo weekend is a short course on Christian living. The weekend involves a full three and a half days from Thursday evening to Sunday evening. Each day starts early and finishes with a late evening. A series of prepared talks and meditations are delivered by the team. Following each talk, there is a discussion within your allocated table group. The weekend includes daily worship services – Morning Prayer, Eucharist and Compline. There will be time for quiet reflection and personal prayer. On Friday and Saturday there are short breaks for a rest in the afternoon.


There are breaks for breakfast, morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, dinner and supper. Special dietary requirements are met. You are not left hungry.

The Cursillo weekend is just the start of a person's journey with Christ.

Also suggest to the candidates that they may wish to set aside the Monday following the weekend for recovery, rest and reflection on their weekend.

Group Reunion Online??

Have you found a Group Reunion to belong to yet?

These days a lot of us are time poor and find it difficult to set aside the time to meet in person. One option may be to meet online for a Group Reunion.

How will that work? Here's a suggestion.

There is lots of Video Conferencing software that could be used for this. ZOOM is just one.

To conduct a group reunion on ZOOM; Requisites are:-

1. Each person needs an Internet connected device with camera and microphone. (Computer, Laptop, Tablet or Smart Phone)

2. One member would need to have a <u>ZOOM Account</u>. (Free to Sign up but meetings with more than 2 people would cut out after 40 minutes.)

3. That member could either create a meeting request link or use their Personal Meeting ID Link.

4. Then send/email that link to Group participants.

5. When participants click on the link, if they don't already have ZOOM App installed, it will ask them to download it, then install it.

6. Arrange a time when everyone joins using that link.

7. Grouping shouldn't go for more than 40 minutes but if you want, you can just re-join using the same link.

8. Let your Cursillo Parish Contact know you are grouping online.

If you are not part of a group, why not start an ONLINE Group Reunion today.

In Christian Fellowship

Lurline Campbell and Don, her husband, made their Cursillo in 1993 (Men's and Women's 33) when Don was the Rector of Surfers Paradise. Lurline and Rev. Don met Amer Qusus in 2009 while looking after the International Anglican Church in Amman, Jordan as short-term workers with the Church Missionary Society between 2009 and 2013. Amer is a remarkable Christian worker in the Church of the Nazarene. In 2008, before the Syrian war, he and Margaret Holt, an Australian CMS missionary, met Iraqi Christian women refugees in Damascus. With financial help from Christians in Australia, these women were introduced into courses which have given them sources of income. Lurline and Don have kept up the friendship and sharing in a ministry in which Amer continues to be involved. Lurline received these, *"Points of Encouragement"* from Amer recently and has sent them on to us for reflection.

The Third Solution from Amer Qusus; a Jordanian Christian friend.

When Lazarus fell ill, Martha and Mary only think of two things. That Christ come and heal; or Lazarus will die and rise in eternity. But Christ came with the third solution, bringing their brother back after four days of death.

When the prodigal son returns and has lost the inheritance, he expects two things; either he is dismissed as a son or is accepted as a worker until the debt is paid. But there was a third solution. Restore the son to his position. Put on new clothes and restore his dignity.

When Jesus' friends asked him who had sinned to cause a man to be born blind, they had two answers: the man or his parents.

But Jesus said, "Not this man and not his father or his mother. But so that the works of God may appear in it."

When it was late, and everyone was hungry at the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus' friends put before Him, two options. Either buy food or let everyone go and find food. But Jesus had another idea. He fed everyone with five loaves of bread and two fish.

The point is, however confused your mind; there is a third solution with God. Don't limit yourself to two options. We forget that God has a third solution that is not subject to human logic or the laws of nature.


Rest assured God has the third solution.


