## ~ A Message from the Diocesan Lay Director ~





Hello to my fellow Cursillistas,

Today, my message is to get back to basics.

In 2021 we have two Cursillo 3-Day Weekends happening in August, a great opportunity to invite your parishioner friends to have a wonderful experience of Christian Community and encouragement of Faith.

What Makes Cursillo Special?

An explanation for those with limited or no knowledge whatsoever of Cursillo: -

Cursillo is another opportunity to gain greater religious depth, with a difference. It is Lay driven with religious oversight. It is an International Lay Movement originating in Spain in the early 40's and gradually spreading globally.

It starts with a 3-Day weekend retreat. You are driven, by a familiar person to the venue, no matter where it is, where there are no distractions. The venue changes each year in our diocese. This year it is Glendalough Outdoor Education Centre, Peregian Beach.

It is not a silent retreat, far from it. All 3 days are full of laughter and singing, fun and spiritual reflection. You see the Lay Leader in charge, follows an agenda as set down by the Spanish Lay elders back in the early 40's; such is the success of the plan. No matter where in the world you attend a Cursillo 3-Day Weekend, the format is the same.

In this diocese, 3795 people have attended a 3-Day weekend since 1985, the year it was endorsed by our Southern Queensland Diocese. It is fair to say 98% of attendees have a positive experience. Most people leave the weekend on a high having found another dimension to their faith. But what happens when the high turns back into everyday life? There is a plan for that too; it is called the Fourth Day.

This part of Cursillo involves keeping the Spirit alive for the whole year and beyond. It is an invitation to attend small gatherings called Group Reunions, larger events called Ultreyas, and special events such as Pilgrimages and refresher days.

So please help your friends to learn about Cursillo; you will be sharing something special.


#### **DID YOU KNOW?**



Thank you for sending me the copy of "On Wings Like Eagles". I was reminded of happy times when I was part of Cursillo. I had my hundredth birthday last February so that means I am on the way to being 101 years. (Margaret turned 101 in February 2021.) Since I became a centenarian, I have been written up in the University of Queensland magazine and the Anglican Focus.

I wondered if I should tell you a bit about my Cursillo?

My husband Jack went to the first one in 1985 and came home on a spiritual high. "You must go Margaret," he said. I could not go until W4 as I was my mother's carer. When she died, I was able to go.



I was on team for W7 and it was at the final eucharist we had to put something of ourselves on the altar. I put my biro. As a result of this, God gave me the gift of writing.


I was a member of Saint David's; Chelmer and they had a monthly News and Views. I think I wrote my first article in 1989 and continued until 2016 when Saint David's News and Views stopped being circulated and I broke my arm. Cursillo forms part of my spiritual journey. I'll always be grateful for the joy of being part of that fellowship. Jack died in 1999. He was on team eight times and was on the team which took Cursillo to New Zealand. Jack's hobby was carpentry and he made hundreds of crosses and other gifts for Cursillo.

I retired here at Aveo Durack in 2002 and became part of Saint Hughes, Inala when I could no longer drive to Saint David's. I know Inala has had quite a few Cursillistas and for a time we used to meet with friends from Algester. Age gets in the way.





## 2021 Warwick Ultreya Report




41 Cursillistas and non-cursillistas attended in person the 2021 Warwick Ultreya held at St Mark's Church. There were 18 people who joined the Ultreya via the internet. The parishes represented at the Ultreya were Allora-Clifton, Booval, Freshwater, Grovely, Hervey Bay, Kangaroo Point, Laidley, Logan, Manly-Tingalpa, Mt Gravatt, Nerang, Sherwood, Stanthorpe, Toowoomba West, Warwick and Waterloo Bay. We also had someone from Thailand join us

via the internet.

Our theme for the day was "Plugged In", from a Meditation in "Walking with God" by David Jeremiah. The scripture on which it was based was John 15:1-11 – "I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing."



The witness speaker, Susan Cruickshank, shared with us the difference that her Cursillo Fourth Day makes in her life. She hoped that we would be encouraged to stock our Cursillo



Before attending her Cursillo weekend she would frequently ask God, "What will I be when I grow up?" After the weekend her question morphed into,

"Who will I be when I grow more?" and its answer takes the words of Catherine of Sienna. She will ... "Be the person God meant [me] to be and [I] will set the world on fire."

Through a difficult 2020, she has been supported by her daily devotional and Bible readings, by the weekly phone group reunion, and attending Ultreyas.

Susan's conclusion to her witness talk: "So wherever we find ourselves this day, this week, this year, may we find ourselves among these present-day saints, cheering each other on in the race set before us. This is no competition, but we are well equipped for the road conditions of our journey. Check out our Cursillo toolkit and the troubleshooting resources in our community relationships, so that those many power sources are plugged in properly, and this world can be set on fire for God."

Reverend Matt Skelton, in his spiritual reflection, spoke about abiding in Jesus. Just as the branches abide in the vine, we are to abide in Jesus who nourishes us with his love and the love of the father. This all comes with an expectation - to bear fruit. And what is that fruit? To love one another as Jesus loves us. Being plugged in to Jesus, being a part of his vine means that we are also decidedly plugged in to his church, the community of believers - indwelt by the spirit - that we should love each other as he loved us. As we abide in Jesus, he will sustain us, equip us, and fill us with overflowing love, through his word, through his spirit, and through his church.



We were challenged by the inclusion of two new songs which had special meaning for Susan: "New Wine" and "Another in the Fire". The Pop-up choir helped us to attempt to sing these songs. The last song, was led ably by lan Carr – De Colores. Ultreya!
