Cursillo is held in high esteem by so many, why is this so?

Some say it was the 3-Day Weekend itself, others say the Fourth Day activities like Ultreyas, Pilgrimages and Grouping. Others have Cursillo as a defining moment in their Spiritual Journey, or something else altogether.

Would you share your thoughts with me on what Cursillo means to you? Your comments will give us a greater understanding of where to focus our efforts. 2022 sees Cursillo in our Diocese reach 37 years with 182 x 3-Day Weekends. As your Diocesan Lay Director, (DLD), there is a feeling of great responsibility to pass the baton to the next DLD with Cursillo in "Good Shape".

My view of "Good Shape" is growth of Cursillo through more Candidates.

In the last 2 years, we have focused on turning more Candidates into Cursillistas.

Those Cursillistas lead to more 3-Day Weekend Team Members.

Team Members gain experience and move to Secretariat and Servant Community.

Secretariat, our decision-making body, comes from Teams and Servant Community.

Candidates are the lifeblood for a future healthy Cursillo Movement.

Since the start, past successive Secretariats have maintained the "Authentic Cursillo". (Strict adherence to the Guidelines set down by the Cursillo founders). 1985 saw enthusiastic Cursillistas emerge from their own 3-Day Weekends. In 2021, M80 & W80 saw their Cursillistas do the same.

There is no need to change a winning formula.

We do need to adapt Cursillo to fit modern ways. In this edition, there is an article on how to increase our Candidate numbers. Please read the article, I would value your input (<u>alangray48@icloud.com</u>) on how this idea may work for your Parish.

Finally

My 3-year term in the role as Diocesan Lay Director will conclude this year in November. I will leave comments on what an honour it has been till then. However, the reason I mention it at all, is Secretariat has chosen my replacement.

What If . . .

Each Parish, Each Year Could Sponsor Just One Candidate?

A new way of looking at Sponsoring Candidates

Let's Start with a Hypothetical

Imagine IF: Each Parish in our Diocese could Sponsor just one Candidate each year?

132 Parishes x 1 Candidate = 132 Candidates (Back to the future for Cursillo to the way we started in 1985-86)

Interesting Fact

For Cursillos held since 2016 (5) the average number of Sponsoring Parishes each year has been 13, that is 13 from 132 Parishes, only 10%.

How Could it Be?

With a program like Cursillo that shares God's love in an environment of joy, fellowship, friendship and fun, why wouldn't we want to shout it from the rooftops in the same way as we would share a good book, recipe, movie, or place to eat?

Why Haven't We Sponsored?

There are so many reasons from affordability to shyness. Added to the mix are the varying costs, different venues, who pays, where to find Forms, and confusion about how to present Cursillo and answer questions like "Is Cursillo a secret society?".

Let's Move Forward We need a Step by Step Plan:

- 1. A "Sponsoring System" to make it easy to Sponsor.
- 2. A stable venue where we can keep the cost affordable.
- 3. A method of education for Parishioners, potential Candidates and Sponsors.
- 4. A method of looking after Sponsors travelling long distances.

Let's Give the Plan a Name OPERATION PARISH CANDIDATE

One Candidate per Parish per Year Target: 132 Candidates per year

What We Can Be Sure Of

Cost: Keeping the cost affordable (under \$300 for the 3-Day Weekend)

Venue: We know where we are going, the facilities there, what we need to bring. Information: A method to get Cursillo education to every Parish and every Candidate.

(Cursillo background to make Candidates feel comfortable about making

the decision to attend the 3-Day Weekend)

Billeting: For long distance Sponsors, a place to stay when delivering & collecting

on the Thursdays & Sundays.

How We Find Candidates? Sponsoring System



- Setting a Background: We want to make the word Cursillo, a household name for everyday Parishioners so they are not daunted by unfamiliar Spanish words.
- **Pride in Candidate**: As Cursillistas of a Parish, we select our Candidate together, all have a say in the Parishioner we've chosen. We all have the Candidate's interest at heart. Parish Group Reunions are the ideal time to discuss Candidate selection.
- Cost: Right now, the cost is \$295 for the 3-Day Weekend
 The Cursillista's Parish will fund \$250 of the amount (if a Candidate needs it.)
 The Candidate funds the balance of \$45.
- **Funding:** Raised from Gold Coin/Note donations at Events e.g., Parish Group Reunions Remember we are only trying to raise a min \$250 in a year for one Candidate. \$250 is only \$6 per week, NOT each but in total. How hard can it be? If we raise more, we can send more Candidates now or save for a Candidate next year.

Selection Process



We pray about this process

- 1. A short list of interested Candidates is chosen from Parishioners by Cursillistas.
- 2. This list is given to your clergy for their approval before doing anything. (They know more background than we do.)
- 3. A small Team of Cursillistas make the first approach to the possible Candidates.
- 4. The result of this approach is relayed back to all Parish Cursillistas.
- 5. A short list of a possible Candidate is made.
- 6. It is up to each Parish Cursillista to reinforce the Cursillo message as the potential Candidate grows closer to a decision to attend a 3-Day Weekend.
- 7. Candidate makes decision to attend Cursillo.
- 8. A Sponsor (Mentor) from our Parish Cursillistas is chosen for the Candidate. *It is the role of Sponsor/Mentor to encourage attendance at Cursillo events (Fourth Day).*

Benefits of This Process

- The responsibility to Sponsor doesn't fall on one person
- The joy of sending a Candidate is felt by the Parish Cursillo community
- The embarrassment of broaching cost is non-existent
- Being shy is covered with a team approach
- These new Cursillistas will be our Parish & Cursillo Leaders of the future
- We are building a stronger Parish Cursillo Community together
- We are doing our bit for OPERATION PARISH CANDIDATE at a Diocesan level

CURSILLO – PILGRIMAGE - HISTORY

Cursillo is a recent movement in the Christian Church. Its beginning was in Majorca Spain in the early 1940's. It did not develop by accident. It began when a group of men dedicated themselves to bringing the young people of their city to know Christ better. It developed as they prayed and worked together and as they talked together, sharing their thoughts about the state of the world and the effectiveness of their efforts to bring the light of Christ to it. The leaders of this group were Bishop Hervas, the then Bishop of Majorca, Father Juan Capo and Eduardo Bonin.

When the Spanish civil war ended in 1939 it was a time of ferment in the Spanish Church. Before the war a great pilgrimage to the Shrine of Saint James at Compostela had been planned. The shrine had been a focal point for the Christian faith during the Middle Ages. After several post-ponements due to World War Two, the pilgrimage was rescheduled for 1948.

Preparation for the pilgrimage provided a sharp focus for the activities that led to the development of Cursillo and helped set the tone.

The spirit of pilgrimage is a spirit of restlessness, of dissatisfaction with spiritual lukewarmness, of moving onward. It is also a spirit of brotherhood and sisterhood among fellow pilgrims who are striving together to reach the goal of a life fully given to the love of God and humankind. This pilgrim style has come to mark much of the spirituality of the Cursillo Movement.

Those who first developed the Cursillo Movement worked together as a team from the very beginning. They worked as a leaders' team that prayed together, shared their Christian lives together, studied together, planned together, acted together and evaluated what they had done together. Together they worked at the task of forming Christian life among the young people of Majorca. Out of their common efforts, something new in the life of the Church was born.

Dinner is served! What's on the DSC plate this year?

Updating processes and procedures in documents of the Anglican Cursillo Movement of Australia – "ACMA" manual is an on-going part of Diocesan Servant Community life. Most of the updating is aimed at assisting the 3-day Weekend Lay Directors. Currently, the group is developing a Workplace Health and Safety section into the Back Table Training day manual. These activities ensure that Cursillo in always improving practices and keeping up

to date. Margaret will be assisting Diocesan Lay Director Alan Gray with the Back Table training in the coming months.

2020 saw ZOOM impact Cursillo in a significant manner. DSC developed documents and sign in sheets for Zoom Ultreyas as well as updated Mananita and Clausura sign in sheets. The Pre Clausura script review was one such script undertaken by this group. Servant Community is also a 'hands on' group of Cursillistas who value the opportunity to be 'doers' in practical ways. We would welcome new members to the group and while most of our meetings are online via Zoom, those available to travel as members of DSC visit parishes to meet parish Cursillistas from time to time.

The Cursillo Method

Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning "little lesson or short course." The little lesson it provides is one that expands over time.

Cursillo helps each person better understand just how much God loves them. It offers a method for living that helps people develop a more personal relationship with Jesus, and



it encourages each person to pursue a course of continual formation, enabling them to better understand the mind of Christ and better understand their faith. As people develop a more personal relationship with Christ and follow Him more closely, they are better able to live the Gospel and actually be the "good news" in the various places that God has put them to live, work and worship. Making a friend, being a friend and bringing that friend to Jesus is the fundamental basis for sharing God's love to others.

The Cursillo small group dynamics during the 3 Day Weekend and continuing afterwards with Group Reunion provide the encouragement and support enabling each person to grow spiritually, leading to an understanding that Christ works through them as they interact with others.



Group reunions are the 'blowtorch' which encourage one another "onward" in their spiritual journey. Many thousands of men and women around the world live the Cursillo method and are enjoying a continuous and progressive spiritual conversion.




Online ZOOM Group Reunions

We would love to hear if you are already using zoom for Group Reunions!

How will that work? Here's the plan.....from Peter Victor - Secretariat Media and Webmaster.

To conduct a group reunion on ZOOM, Requisites are:

- 1. Each person needs an Internet connected device with camera and microphone. (Computer, Laptop, Tablet or Smart Phone)
- 2. One member would need to have a **ZOOM Account**. (Free to Sign up but meetings with more than 2 people would cut out after 40 minutes)
- 3. That member could either create a meeting request link or use their Personal Meeting ID Link.
- 4. Then send/email that link to Group participants.
- 5. When they click on the link, if they don't already have ZOOM App installed, it will ask them to download it, then install it (it's free!).
- 6. Arrange a time when everyone joins using that link.
- 7. Grouping shouldn't go for more than 40 minutes but if you want you can just re-join using the same link.
- 8. Let your Cursillo Parish contact know you are grouping online.
