~ A Message from the Diocesan Spiritual Advisor ~



I had a fall a few days ago – sounds a very geriatric thing to do, doesn't it?

The thing is I was running!

I've got a walk planned for October, and another for January so I'm intentionally working to increase my strength, endurance, and lung capacity. All year I've been intentionally increasing my walking speed and intensity, and one morning I said to myself *why not jog?* Excellent.

It worked well for weeks, until the last Monday in August!

The tip of my shoe kissed an uneven lip of concrete on the footpath. Do you remember seeing cartoons where the character windmills along before ending up flat on their face on the ground? Well, that was me. POOOOOPHPH. That was the sound of the wind being knocked out of me.

It was 5:15 in the morning; there was no one else around. Eventually I caught my breath, found my feet, dusted myself down and realised there was blood – lots of it. OUCH! It wasn't till I got home that I saw the damage. Gravel rash on nose, upper lip, chin, chest, hands, forearm, knee – and my mittens were shredded.

And that's how I've presented to the world. All scabby! And do you know what has surprised me? – no one has said *Ouch, that looks painful. Do you want to talk about what happened?* **IT WAS AS IF NO ONE CARED. I felt invisible!** Eventually I challenged a friend, *I thought you wouldn't want to talk about it.* **I THOUGHT!** You know what is said about assumptions don't you? They make an ass out of you and me.

I encourage everyone to be the caring face and presence of Jesus Christ - actively.

Remember Hebrews 13:2 about showing hospitality to strangers and so entertaining angels? Hospitality is about offering friendship, creating a space where the stranger can know themselves accepted, unbound, freely accepted as they are, where they can 'be well'.

I know how I feel when I'm welcomed, accepted into the whole. I relax, I'm energised, freed to be who and whose I am. When I'm not welcomed, I doubt myself, turn inward, shrivel up. I feel excluded, not accepted and not acceptable. This is painful. If it happens often enough, I will question my identity as a being created in the image and likeness of God.

I'm aware of how intensely our culture works at keeping fit – at training our bodies. Do we, as Christians, as Cursillistas, make the same commitment to developing our practice of loving and caring for God's creation?

Please take to heart this extract from Tim Celek and Dieter Zander, *Inside the Soul of a New Generation* (p.107 – 108)

Do you know, do you understand that you represent Jesus to me? Do you know, do you understand that when you treat me with gentleness, it raises the question in my mind that maybe he is gentle, too?

If you are interested and care, I think maybe Jesus cares and is interested too -- and then there's this flame of hope that burns inside of me, and for a while, I am afraid to breathe because it might go out.


Do you know, do you understand that your words are his words?

St Mark's, Daisy Hill provided our Training centre, and that was a blessing – about as central as possible for those travelling north or south, and only a few metres off the M1. However, several of the M81 Team had difficulties getting to each training day and some even more difficulty settling on the final draft of their talks. I caught the covid bug in the middle of it, and of course, we had to contend with using a “new” site for the Weekends after The James Byrne Centre became unavailable. It was with some relief that we finally unpacked at Camp Tamborine. (Proctor Rob Clark and I had the advantage of much assistance from Kay, after the ladies had sorted out many issues with the site over their Weekend.)
